## CAREERS AND TRANSITION FACULTY

Term 3 has been extremely busy for the team. Our Year 12 students are currently researching their post-school pathway including opportunities for TAFE and apprenticeships/traineeships for 2023. Students are learning about different course requirements and developing their plan for post school. It is fantastic to see many students already have ideas and plans about what pathway they would like to enter after they finish school. Furthermore, our university applications have been finalised with several of our students receiving early offers for next year. We congratulate those students who have received these offers! As this will be the last time we will be working alongside Year 12, the team wishes Year 12 the very best in their future endeavours.

Year 11 students have been upskilling themselves to become job ready for when they leave school. Students have had opportunities to complete short courses at TAFE to get knowledge and foundational skills in different pathways. Students will have the opportunity in Term 4 to complete a combination of First Aid Training, White Card Training and RSA & RCG qualifications to also support them in becoming job ready.

Our Year 11 Virtual TAFE students have been working throughout the year towards their TAFE qualification through weekly online classes. Virtual TAFE student Mirna has explained what she learns from her course:

At Virtual TAFE I study Social Media Retailing/Certificate III in Retail. I do this course at school every Wednesday. It starts from 12:00 pm till 3:00pm. As part of the course, we study how to create content to connect with consumers and increase the visibility of products and companies. This has significant advantages for me and my future job because it can open up doors to new chances and careers.

The team will be offering Year 11 2023 students the opportunity to complete a Virtual TAFE course as part of their HSC. If your child is interested, they will need to speak to Ms K Ly (Head Teacher).

#### Moving Forward - Working in the Air-Conditioning Industry

The company that I had work experience with was Active Cooling Solutions (ACS). During the morning I left the house at around 6am and headed to Flemington Sydney markets, where we fixed the rapid cooling doors. These are coolroom doors that slide up and down very fast and are designed for commercial coolrooms. When we were at the first site we were switching the electricity circuits for the remote controller, so that they could walk around and open the doors instead of going to the control panel. We were missing one of the circuits that were needed to change the operating system, so then we went to the electrical shop and got the circuit we needed and then finished off at that site.

On the second day, we went to a commercial factory in Ingleburn and installed a 7kw split system. We put everything into the indoor unit and got the outdoor unit ready, after that we went outside to drill the outside walls for the drainage pipes.

On the third day we went back to finish the job and we did the electricity for the split system, but we had difficulty with the control panel for the indoor unit. This was the first problem we have had to encounter and therefore, we had to contact technical support. After that I installed the light strips inside the coolroom by connecting and striping cables. I enjoyed it because of the freedom and the variety of work that I completed and all the new things that I learned. I thank ACS and Daniel for providing me with this opportunity to have an idea what a typical week of work would be like.
