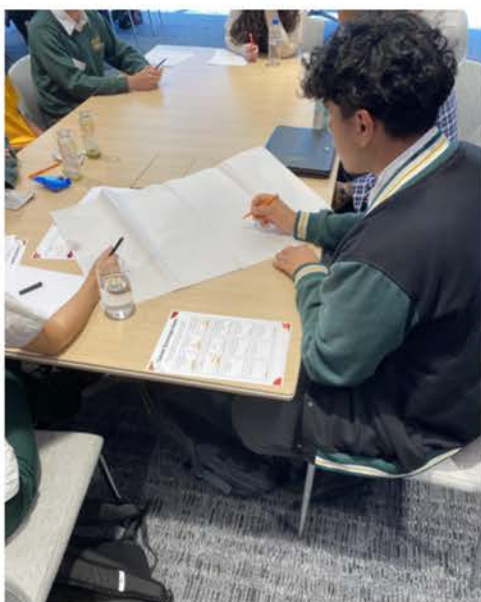

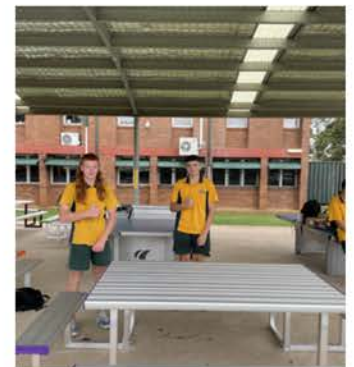

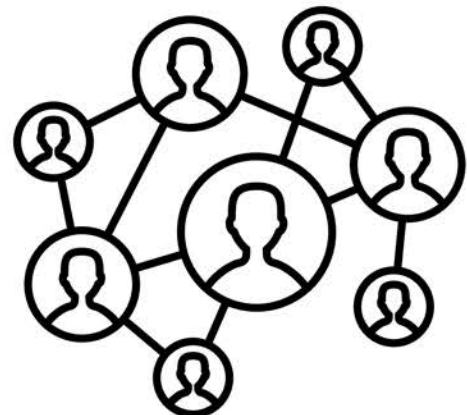

Born in Guangzhou in 1978 and based in Beijing, she has documented China's rapid urbanisation and digital revolutions for over two decades. Her acclaimed films, photography and large-scale installations offer thrilling encounters with the disorienting, quick-fire transformations of the new millennium.

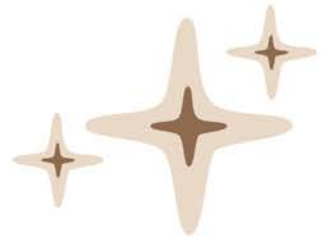
The students had a fantastic time learning and perfecting their barista skills. We can't wait to see the impact of this experience on their future endeavours!

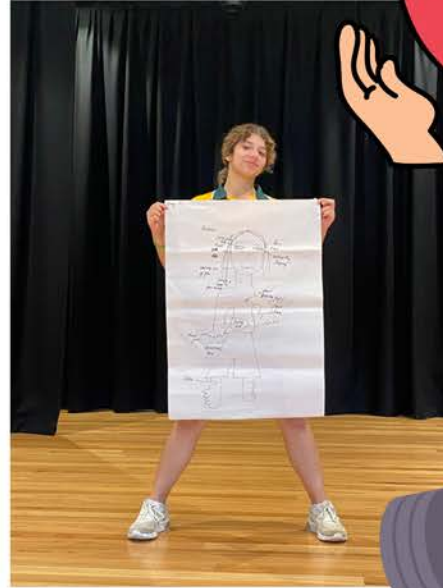
